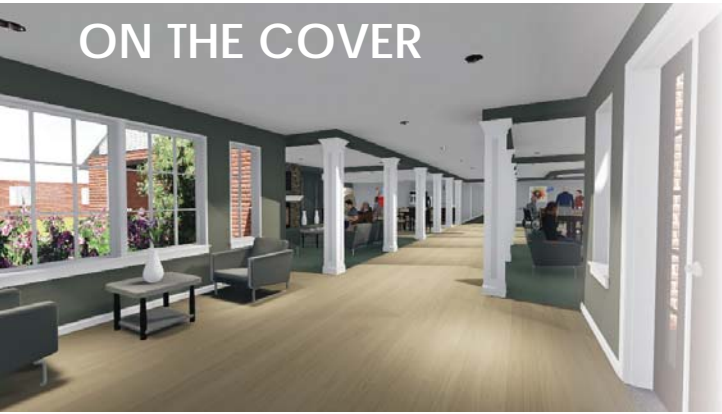

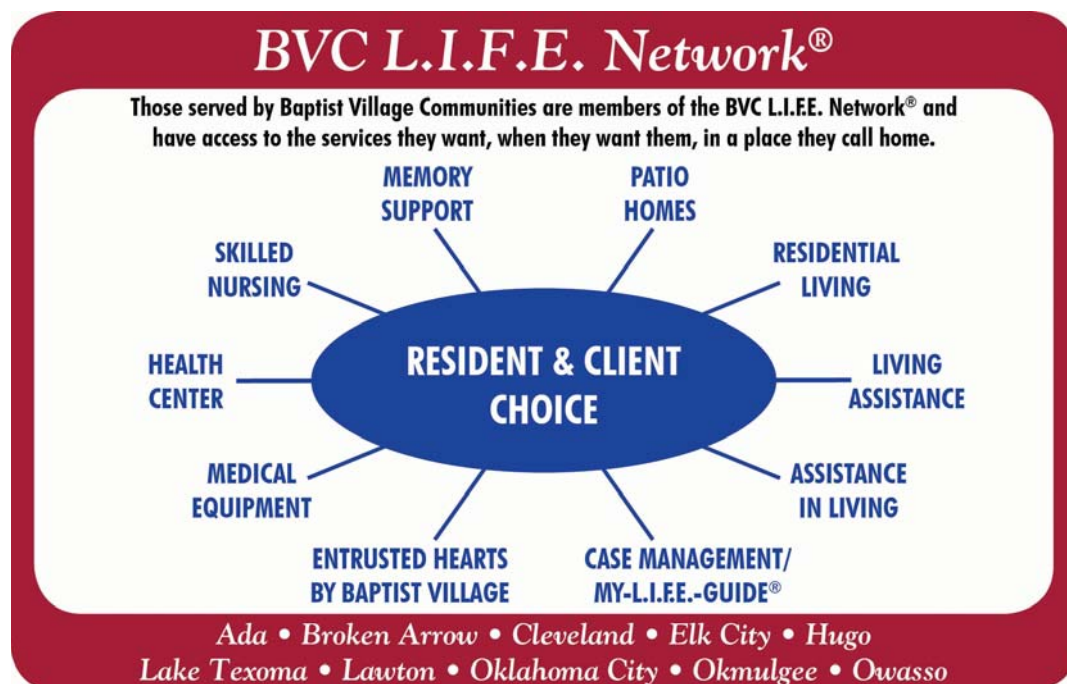

Baptist Village Communities (BVC) is proud to be shaping the future of aging services in Oklahoma and beyond. To continue this tradition of excellence, BVC is excited to be planning considerable enhancements to five Baptist Villages in eastern Oklahoma.

Villages in Broken Arrow, Cleveland, Hugo, Okmulgee and Owasso will benefit greatly through the "Together We Serve" campaign.

"God has called many people to be a part of the BVC ministry," says Dr. Bill Pierce, BVC president. "We appreciate so very much those who give to enhance the lives of the people we serve."

BVC is happy to say that two of the capital projects are either completed or underway.

Thanks to the generosity of several individuals, the outdoor life enrichment venue at Baptist Village of Broken Arrow was completely paid for and is now finished. The venue was officially opened in April, hosting a cookout for Eagle Ridge patio home residents.

Additionally, the Sycamore Square neighborhood in Owasso now has a new name, Unity Square, and soon will feature a new look. A sizeable common area, café and living room is now under construction to be completed in the coming months.

The outdoor venue in Broken Arrow and Owasso's Unity Square renovation are the first in what BVC hopes is a lengthy list of enhancements throughout the five campuses. More updates on these projects will be coming soon.

OWASSO RESIDENT HAPPY TO DO WHATEVER NEEDS TO BE DONE IN THE DINING ROOM

The Redbud dining room at Baptist Village of Owasso is very organized and ready to go daily. This is due in large part to resident Mae Belle Reed.

The 88-year-old resident has been volunteering in the dining room consistently since moving to the Village nearly eight years ago.

"I moved to Baptist Village Communities in October 2008," says Reed. "It was not a long trip to move here. After moving from Tulsa, my late husband, Les, and I lived for 25 years just one mile away from the Village."

The Reeds moved to the Village due to her husband's health needs. After his passing, an apartment home was available for Mae Belle, and she has lived at the Village ever since.

It did not take long for her to get involved in Village life, particularly in the Redbud dining room. Her efforts have been noticed by many others on campus.

Chaplain Steve Williams says, "Mae Belle arrives around 9 am and works until about 12:30 pm. She does a great many things for the dining room. These include keeping the coffee made and hot, filling glasses with ice, cleaning the trays and working the register."

"She also refills the empty creamers, napkins, salt and pepper shakers and restocks the crackers. She restocks the cups, bowls and saucers for the salad bar. When needed, she will even dish the desserts like cobblers and ice cream. **Basically, she is willing to do anything that needs to be done.**"

Dining services volunteer Howard Cox concurs with Steve. "We simply couldn't get along without her."

When asked why Mae Belle does what she does, she responds, "I do it to stay active, and I love people. I get to see people I wouldn't otherwise get to see. Besides, It gives me the opportunity to say something encouraging to people. We have a lot of fun."

She continues, "Each resident has different wants and needs. We try to accommodate and work with them as best as possible. I am pleased to help. What you give gets returned to you."

Mae Belle certainly enjoys playing an instrumental role in the dining room. However, she adamantly insisted that others be given their fair share of credit, as well.

"I certainly am not alone. I'm a little embarrassed to be featured, as this truly is a team effort. My friend Darla on the dining services team plays a major role in prep. She works hard. There are also several volunteers besides me, including Donna, Ed and Sara. Even (Campus Director) Nathan Purifoy helps out in a pinch."

Reed enjoys not just dining room service, but Village life as a whole.

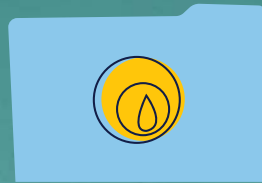

And Mae Belle has seen a lot of places. Her late husband's job as a Christian comedian meant they traveled all over Oklahoma and surrounding states. They even traveled to Florida and some places back east. When memory challenges forced Les to step down, they "retired" from the road.

But Mae Belle wouldn't trade her life at Baptist Village for anything.

"I feel like the Lord led me here. I tell all my friends about how great BVC is, too. I'm happy. This is where I want to be."

And Baptist Village of Owasso is thrilled to have this sweet-spirited lady.

Baptist Village Communities (BVC) is blessed to have hundreds of people support BVC financially every year. Through this, we have been able to help countless residents and Friends Team members in many ways.

The "I Give" program encourages Friends Team members and residents to provide support to the Adams Assistance Fund. The Adams Fund provides assistance to residents with financial challenges.

Baptist Village has promoted giving to the Adams Fund as part of our I Give program the last four years. The program has seen a radical jump in Friends Team members giving, from about 35 when the program started to now more than 275 givers.

Terry Dennis, campus director at Baptist Village of Cleveland, gives to the Adams Fund. "For nearly 13 years, I have had the pleasure of sharing good news with older adults. These individuals want to live at Baptist Village, but can't because of limited income. I love to be able to tell them, 'yes, you can enjoy all the blessings of living here because friends of BVC give to the Adams Fund.'"

"Many times, I get to see tears of sadness replaced with tears of joy. Friends they likely will never meet have given from their heart to make living at the Village possible."

Baptist Village also has exceptional financial support from its Board members. Long-time Board member and former chairman of the Board, Paul Abbott, explains why he and his wife, Betty, support BVC and the Adams Fund.

"Betty and I give to the Adams Fund because we believe it is the right thing to do. We want to be obedient to God in all that we do. God's Word instructs us to take care of the widows and those that are in need. So many have given their lives so unselfishly to His work, and now they need help in their later years. We count it a privilege and honor to be able to contribute to this Fund."




Finally, BVC is thrilled to have residents who give. Baptist Village of Oklahoma City resident Thelma Clark eagerly shares what the Adams Fund means to her.

"When my husband and I first moved to Baptist Village in 2007, we had heard about the Adams Assistance Fund and how it was being used to assist those in need to be able to live at Baptist Village. So we asked a neighbor friend of ours, and she said it was a very worthy cause and she would highly recommend giving to this Fund. So right then, we budgeted an amount of money for the Fund and have been giving ever since. We have nothing but praise on how the Fund is being used."

"I know there are so many who cannot afford to live at Baptist Village, and we wanted to help. I receive a report each year of how the Fund is being used and how others are being helped. The Home Office is always so nice in informing us how the Fund is helping others, and we are glad to be a part of it."

The Adams Fund provided \$22,000 in assistance in 2000. Last year, BVC provided assistance to the tune of \$559,000. That is an average increase of more than \$35,000 a year, and this need is constantly growing. With the Adams Fund's current rate of assistance, it will be very challenging to keep up with the growing demand.

Baptist Village Communities is strongly encouraging Friends Team, residents, Board members, support team members, and you to consider giving to the Adams Assistance Fund.

chaplains ministry report 2015

Baptist Village Communities (BVC) has the privilege and joy of placing a chaplain in every Village to coordinate ministry with residents, clients, families and Friends Team members. Many of the chaplains are volunteers.

Each chaplain is challenged to enhance ministry by organizing residents into teams and equipping them for service. It is rewarding to see residents exercising their own unique spiritual gifts and talents, ministering to one another and Friends Team members. The Village chaplains and ministry teams reported the following results from their combined efforts in 2015:

social accountability 2015

Opportunities to provide community services are multiplied every day throughout Baptist Village Communities (BVC). They are the natural activities of our organization, whose mission is to honor God by creating communities and services to enhance lives and enable people to serve God and one another. These services help meet unmet needs in communities.

Since its founding 58 years ago in 1958, we have grown to include eight Villages, three home health agencies and a medical equipment company. The number of people ministered to daily has grown from 1,150 in 1993 to more than 2,200 in 2015 - a 91 percent increase.

The social accountability report allows you to understand how BVC impacted its surrounding communities, providing charitable services in the towns and cities BVC serves.

Annually, we document our social accountability. Campus directors record their charitable services and community programs. In 2015, BVC provided benefits to residents, Friends Team members and the surrounding areas.

BVC also provides outright benevolence to residents who need financial assistance. Along with the generosity of Friends Team members and other residents, financial needs are being met. Senior adults, families and children are assisted with basic needs, such as provision of food, health services and housing.



Meeting community needs includes, but is not limited to:

- Caregivers supporting the elderly in the community
- Elderly living alone or with few social opportunities
- Homebound senior adults having difficulty with daily living activities
- Widows and couples with limited resources and income
- People in need of services they may otherwise be unable to receive

Using the Adams Assistance Fund to assist with monthly service fees, we gave out more than \$559,000 last year. Those assisted through this Fund are residents who, without it, would be unable to meet their monthly expenses.

The Friends Teams and residents of several Villages have participated and volunteered their time to help with free home health services. They provide services for residents receiving Medicaid, where there is a shortfall in reimbursement.

BVC provided charitable services to their broader communities by meeting financial, health and community needs - serving 5,775 people with a value of \$2,777,682.57.

In 2015, BVC provided hundreds of services in Oklahoma communities. These needs were met by providing the following services, among others:
